

Georgian Artists Celebrate their Homeland

An exhibition of Georgian artists opened on May 25th at ARTEast gallery, in honour of Georgia's Independence Day. Georgian people, even though they often live far from their motherland, traditionally retain deep links with it, through Georgian traditions, customs, language, and even lifestyle. That's why you can immediately feel a unique Georgian atmosphere in every single painting and piece of art and you won't mix it up with anything else, once you've seen them. It's not just the colours, which are as bright as Georgian nature, or the faces or the architecture, it's the whole composition, very different from what we see in "northern" paintings.

The Georgian Ambassador, whose embassy organised the exhibition, attended the opening and was given a tour by Gia Mimiushvili, who introduced him to the pieces exhibited. Other popular Ukrainian artists came to honour Georgian Independence Day and to experience the unique atmosphere. Ukraine and Georgia, once being parts of one country, need to maintain cultural relations and cooperation, which are no less important than political and economical ones.
