

EXHIBITION: "Their World was not Saved by Their Beauty." Influential Ukrainian artists Viktor Zaretskyi and Alla Horska, both brave and talented, were once persecuted for their strong beliefs in human rights. Horska's tragic story is reflected in her paintings and mosaics, which show her determination to abolish repression and expresses frustration and anger. She was twice banned from the Union of Ukrainian Artists and later murdered. Viktor Zaretskyi's images are not of people struggling, but rather of people smiling, naive and blind to the hardships of life.
